SECTION B

POSITION PURPOSE

This new role is being established while Snow Sports NZ considers its approach to High Performance support for Freeride as it transitions towards an Olympic discipline and becomes eligible for High Performance support from HPSNZ. By providing dedicated freeride support at two key international events athletes will benefit from support, Snow Sports NZ will continue to learn about what it takes to perform at the highest levels and what future high performance support might look like.

POSITION OBJECTIVE

- Provide support for athletes in their preparation for and at the 2026 FIS Freeride World Championship and 2026 FIS Junior World Championship events.
- Support the Park & Pipe Head Coach with the design and delivery of 2025 NZ Preparation Camps.
- Report back to Snow Sports NZ following the events to inform the 2034 Freeride High Performance Strategy.

1. NZ Preparation Camp

- Athletes are clear on their personal goals for these events.
- Team building occurs selected athletes and the Team Manager/Coach leave the camp knowing each other better with an enhanced understanding of how the team can best function to support individual and collective success.
- Athletes are made familiar with event details including location, logistics, competition faces and what previous success has looked like at the venue.

2. Successful World Champs

- Team Manager/Coach is pro-active and engaged in all aspects of performance planning and support.
- Athletes and parents are able to give feedback to the manager/coach and Snow Sports NZ.
- Athletes feel they are central to decision making.
- Athletes rate the Team Manager/Coach role has had a positive impact on their performance.
- Images and media from the events are captured and shared with Snow Sports NZ Communications Manager to complement media releases.

3. Reporting for future Freeride planning

- A detailed report is written on the events (template provided by Snow Sports NZ).
- Team Manager/Coach takes part in a debrief with Snow Sports NZ High Performance staff to explore the events, athlete performance and implications for the future.
